Applicant is requesting a variance to Municipal Code Section 225 – Attachment 2, Schedule II R-2 Residential

Applicant is requesting permission to construct a covered porch with a 28.3 front yard setback. The code stipulates that the minimum front yard setback must be 35'.

Applicant is requesting a variance to Municipal Code Section 225-11, C1 Open Space

Applicant is requesting permission to construct a porch addition at 105 Princeton Place in a required yard. The code stipulates that every part of a required yard must be open to the sky unobstructed.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: Shannon explained that she would like to construct a porch on the front of the house with a roof perhaps at a later date. Bill Riter questioned the applicant with regards to beginning the project before applying for the variance. She stated the porch would have no screens and will never be enclosed.

The Chairman asked three times if there was anyone in the audience who would like to speak in favor of granting the variance. Mr. George Knaisch of 45 N. Lincoln was in favor of granting the variance and complimented the resident on the work she has done to improve the look of the hosue.

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The Chairman then asked if the Secretary had received any communications either for, or against, granting the variance. The Secretary stated the Village Planning Board voted in favor of granting of this variance.
